Health

3.8 Oral health

The setting provides care for children and promotes health through promoting oral health

and hygiene, encouraging healthy eating, healthy snacks and tooth brushing.

•Fresh drinking water is available at all times and easily accessible.

Sugary drinks are not served to pre-school children.

•A maximum 150ml of fruit juice may be served to school aged children as part of their

breakfast in the before school club.

Only water and milk are served with morning and afternoon snacks.

Children are offered healthy nutritious snacks with no added sugar.

Parents are discouraged from sending in confectionary as a snack or treat. If this

happens in school (for example, a child hands out sweets for a birthday celebration)

children attending the after school club are asked to take their sweets home.

Staff do not hand out chocolate or sweets as prizes / gifts.

Cooking and baking activities should encourage healthy eating. Cakes and biscuits

should not have added confectionary. If sugary treats are made for a special occasion

children take them home to be eaten at the discretion of their parents.

Pacifiers/dummies

•Parents / carers are advised to stop using dummies/pacifiers once their child is 12

months old.

Dummies / pacifiers should not be used in the setting as the minimum admission age is

24 months.

Staff should work closely with parents to identify ways to calm and settle a child without

the use of a dummy / pacifier.
